– A KLOTZ DIGITAL XENON console was installed earlier this year in the University of Newcastle's media production facilities in Callaghan, Australia. The acquisition of these facilities has enhanced the Bachelor of Communication and the major areas of Video, Sound, Radio, PR and Journalism which are offered by the degree. Over the past years the university's technical staff have rapidly upgraded facilities, adding equipment that will further enrich student learning experiences through hands-on industry standard technology. Funding towards the end of 2006

allowed for the replacement of an old analogue broadcast console which had been in use in teaching of radio and journalism courses for approximately 12 years.

"I had done some investigation into digital broadcast consoles and it basically came down to two consoles from KLOTZ DIGITAL's rival manufacturers," admits George Hyde, the Technological Officer (Audio) of the university's school of Design, Communication and IT. "What swayed me to the XENON was its out-of-the-box pre-configuration. Finally a twelve fader XENON console was chosen as an eye-catching and functional centrepiece for the universities radio studio which was being upgraded at the same time as the editing suits. In the meantime students, lecturers and technicians have had the opportunity to gain experience with the new console and all of them are pleased with the working results.
